





Carpool

Carpool Procedure (Pick Up)

Start 3:40pm

As cars arrive, student names are called out (orange). Having your window sign is helpful.

Move all the way forward to the cone.

Students are lined up in order inside the school to be released in batches (green).

Safety Patrol students open and close doors!

Next batch moves forward.

Usually done ~4pm





•Parents MUST fill out a form at the beginning of the year listing adults allowed to pick up their child

•All Kindergarten and First Grade students MUST be picked up by an adult each day

•Parents/Adults MUST show picture ID in order to take their child

•Walkers dismiss from the outside cafeteria doors at 3:45

School Health

IMMUNIZATIONS

- Must be current
- The parent, guardian or responsible person has 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to present the required written proof of immunizations. The child <u>CAN be</u> excluded from school until proof is provided.
- If you have any questions about your child's immunizations please contact the school prior to the start date.





School Health

Kindergarten Health Assessment (Kindergarten Physical)

- The parent, guardian or responsible person has 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to submit the required health assessment form to the school.
- The child CAN be excluded from school until proof of the assessment is provided.



Medications

- Medications will be administered at school ONLY if a Physician Order for Medication form, 1702 is completed, signed by physician and parent and is in the possession of school officials.
- These forms are available at the front office.
- The Medication form and the pharmacy label information must match!
- ALL medications must be brought to school by parent/guardian.
- ALL medications must be in the original pharmacy container with original label on it.







Children with Chronic Illness

- If your child has a chronic illness such as diabetes, severe asthma, severe allergies or seizures, please contact your school nurse.
- A health care plan can be developed indicating steps to be taken if your child requires medical care at school.

•supports students academically, personal/social and career development through classroom lessons for all students


•small groups/lunch buddies

* Level 4 is NOT more! * Level 4 is not necessarily the next grade level (*Go deep before going wide*.) * Level 4 is not just for AG students or for all AG students. * Level 4 is not always writing more. * Level 4 is not based on products. * Level 4 is not longer, neater, prettier.
* Level 4 is not solely student initiative nor solely teacher directed.

* Level 4 is not getting the work done quickly.
